47% of parents believe babies develop this ability at 1 year of age or older.

Meet Sherri and baby Ben

"The best way to describe my previous life is utter chaos.

I was lucky though and got into treatment."

While Sherri continued to work on her sobriety, she met Steve, a construction worker and father of two.

"We hit it off right away and got married six months later."

A year later Steve accepted a job that brought them to Central Oregon. After arriving in their new town, Sherri discovered she was pregnant.

"I was so excited and petrified all at the same time!"

Determined to be the best mom she could be, Sherri searched for resources and found the Family Resource Center. In Sherri's first parenting class, *Make Parenting a Pleasure*, she was pleasantly surprised.

"I've learned a lot and I feel so much more prepared to parent my son. A pandemic is a crazy time to have a baby, it's so isolating - this experience felt more like a community than a class and I needed that."

Creating a sense of community, increasing knowledge of child development, helping parents manage stress and build confidence are cornerstones of all Family Resource Center Programs.
